

About iRecycle



In the spring of 2008, URRC and Spartanburg Coca-Cola distributors partnered together to launch iRecycle, an innovative recycling program in Spartanburg County schools. URRC provides recycling bins and other promotional supplies to get the students involved in recycling and Coca-Cola then collects these recyclable items after delivering their products to the schools. A prototype program was started in Spartanburg School District 5, holding a naming contest for the program. Christina Jackson from Florence Chapel Middle School won, choosing the name "iRecycle." The program has been a tremendous success, operating in schools, businesses, and throughout the community, with plans to continue expanding!

Since iRecycle began we have collected **1,300,000** bottles from our community! This has saved 270 cubic yards of landfill space.

URRC and Coca-Cola are very excited to announce the winners of the iRecycle scholarships. Amber Osment from Chesnee High School, Sarah DeVos and Komal Patel from Byrnes High School all received scholarships. Our goal, with the help of this race, will be to give a scholarship to all participating high schools.

We have also sponsored the Upstate Chapter of Wildlife Action "Lost Acres" outdoor education center. These funds will help to restore the forest and teach younger generations about responsible environmental stewardship.

URRC, Coca-Cola, & NURRC

Headquartered in Spartanburg, SC, URRC was founded in 1992. The company originally provided services to the polyester or PET, silver film recovery market. In 1994, it developed and patented the UnPet process for chemically super cleaning PET (polyethylene terephthalate) chip for food grade packaging. In 1996 it entered into a development agreement with The Coca-Cola Company to perfect the process for "bottle-to-bottle recycling." In 2000 the FDA (Food and Drug Administration) issued its letter of non-objection to clear the way for commercial food grade applications.



As part of Coca-Cola's long-term initiative to have 100 percent of its plastic bottles recycled or reused, URRC signed an agreement with Coca-Cola in 2007 to form a new venture, NURRC. Coca-Cola invested \$60 million to build a new facility, forming the largest bottle-to-bottle recycling plant in the world. The new plant expanded URRC's existing operations from 10 million pounds of recycled chip to 100 million pounds per year. In addition to the financial and energy-saving benefits of recycling plastic, the Spartanburg plant is expected to eliminate the production of one million metric tons of carbon dioxide emissions over the next ten years.

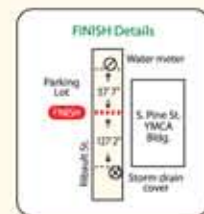

LOCATION OF KEY POINTS

- START** On S. Pine in front of Residence #14 and across from Res. #333. Point is 22' southeast of metal water meter in street and 38' 4" northwest of a metal water meter cover in grass.
- 1 MILE:** On S. Pine in front of #906 (Case Bros. Piano & Organ). Point is 92' 5" southeast of a storm drain and 9' 2" northwest of a metal sewer cover in street.
 - 2 MILE:** On Greenway Trail. Point is 548' northwest of metal gate post at Country Club Drive.
 - 3 MILE:** On Lakeside beside Res # 201 Park. Point is 107' 9" east of N. Park St.
 - 4 MILE:** On W. Park St. beside Res #240 driveway. Point is 144' south of Duke Power Pole #12814412
 - 5 MILE:** On Duncan Park Dr. beside ballfield parking lot. Point is 54' 7" south of a storm drain and 104' north of a fire hydrant on west side of street.
 - 6 MILE:** On Greenway Trail. Point is 771' 8" northwest of a metal gate post at Marion Ave.
 - 7 MILE:** (2nd Loop) On S. Pine St. Point is 3' 6" northwest of a metal sewer cover and 76' 4" southeast of a storm drain.
 - 8 MILE:** (2nd Loop) On S. Pine St. beside #1002 (Brook Construction). Point is 44' 3" southeast of a metal water main cover.
 - 9 MILE:** (2nd Loop) On Greenway Trail under a major power line. Point is 1002' 6" southeast of a metal post at Forest Ave. and 705' northwest of Park split rail fence.
 - 10 MILE:** (2nd Loop) On N. Park Dr. at the intersection of Rivermont. Point is 72' 8" southeast of a fire hydrant.
 - 11 MILE:** (2nd Loop) On Park Dr. in front of Res #250. Point is 5' 5" north of a paved trail in Duncan Park and 78' 5" south of a fire hydrant.
 - 12 MILE:** (2nd Loop) On Union St. in front of Res #780. Point is 73' 8" northwest of a storm drain and 43' 5" southeast of a metal gas meter cover.
 - 13 MILE:** (2nd Loop) On Henry St. across from Bus. #351 (Ribault St. Eatery). Point is 70' southwest of Ribault St.
- FINISH** On Ribault St. in front of Regional Physicians Network and across from YMCA Bldg. Point is 37' 7" south of a metal water cover in street and 127' 2" north of a storm drain in street.
